Purpose of the Document


This Runtime Environment Installation Guide is intended for system administrators and describes how to install NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework RTE.

Terms and Abbreviations

Here is the list of basic terms you will come across when working with this document:

- **Extended mode** – a mode that is used for Active Directory authentication.
- **Record** – an object of Subsystem.
- **Simple mode** – a mode that is used for authentication in custom applications and systems.
- **Subsystem** – an object of Active Directory that contains such data as usernames, passwords, records, custom data, etc. These data are used by NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework. NetIQ SDK examples use default subsystem named "PasswordStore".

System Requirements


 Installing and removing this product requires **Local Administrator** privileges.

Before installing the product, check that the following system requirements are fulfilled:


- Microsoft Windows 7 (x64/x86) SP1/ Microsoft Windows 8 (x86/x64);
- Microsoft Windows Server 2008 R2 SP1/ Microsoft Windows Server 2003 (x64/x86) SP2/
Microsoft Windows Server 2003 R2 (x64/x86) SP2;
- 24 Mb free space on hard disk drive.


Installing and Removing NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework Runtime Environment

RTE (Runtime Environment) allows to use SDK (Software Developer Kit) with no need to install "NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework – Client" package. It is useful when you would like to use NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework technology to secure access to certain applications only, without changing the regular Windows logon procedure. RTE authenticators can also be cached provided that caching is allowed by system administrator.

Installing RTE

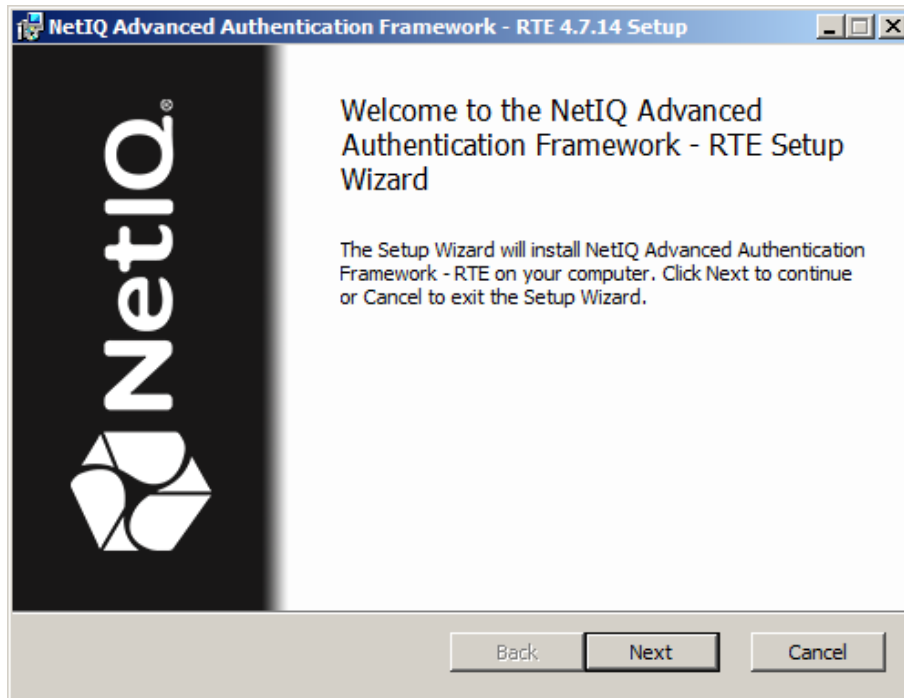
 If RTE should be installed on non-domain client/thin client, it will be necessary to use msi parameter **WEBSERVICEURL** and specify path to NetIQ Web Service to check the license. E.g.: **msiexec /i rte.msi WEBSERVICEURL="https://core.authasas.local:8232/Service.svc/bsc"**. It is supported only from version 4.8.216.

 The start of installation may be frozen for a time up to 1 minute in the case of offline mode. This delay occurs due to check of digital signature of component.

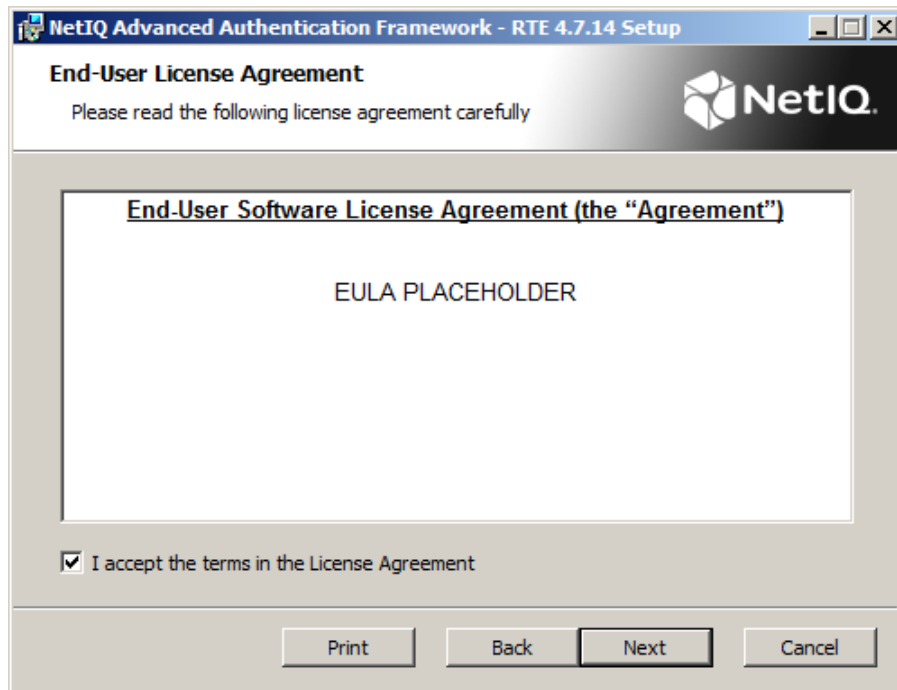
To install RTE via Setup Wizard:

1. Run **Autorun.exe** from NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework distribution kit. Tick **RTE** in the list of components and click **Continue**.

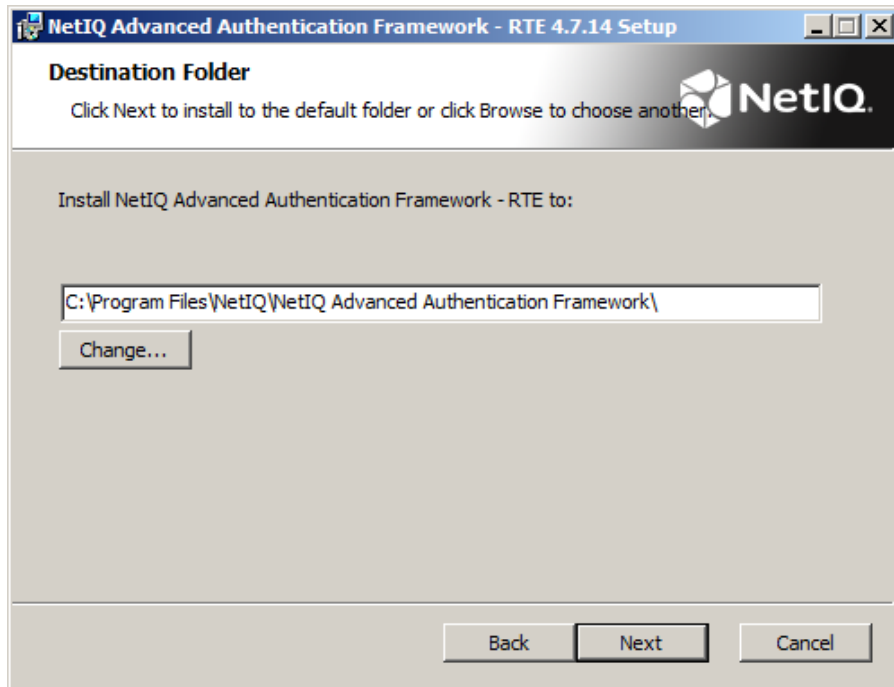
2. Click **Next** to continue.



3. Read the **License agreement**. Click **I accept the terms in the license agreement** and then click **Next**.

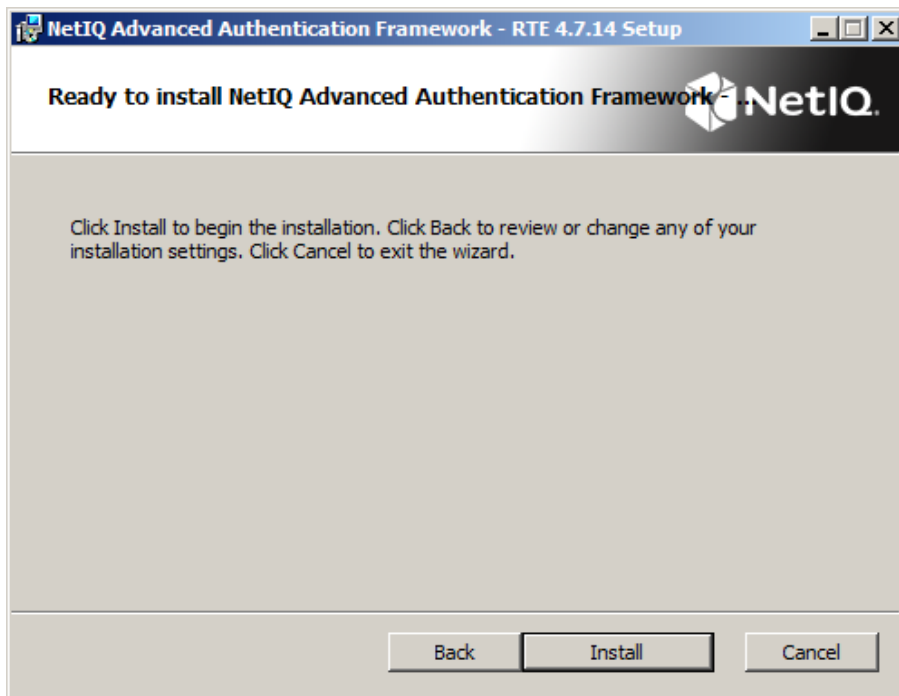


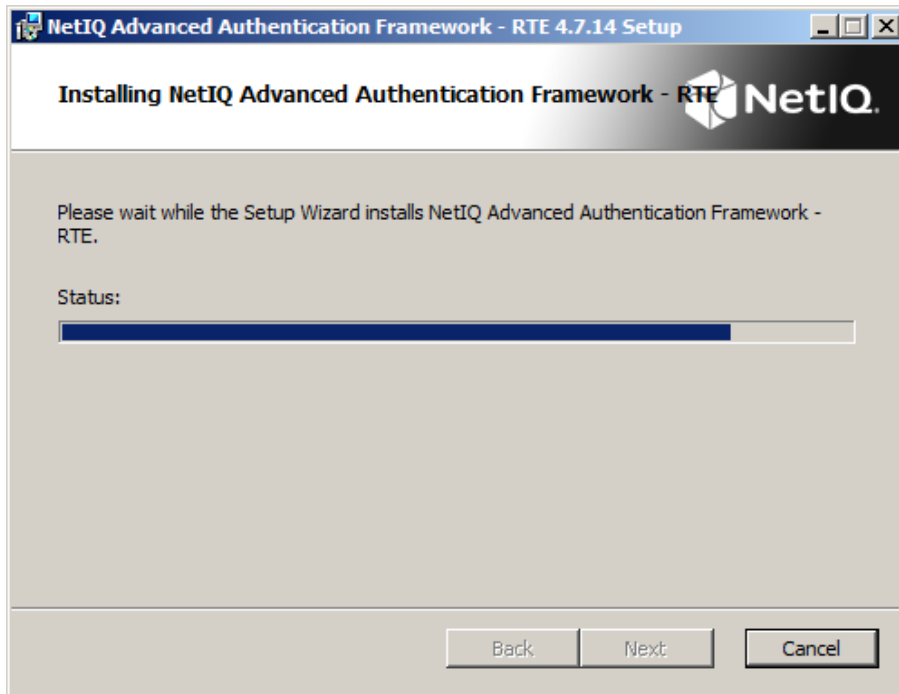
4. Check the destination folder and path.



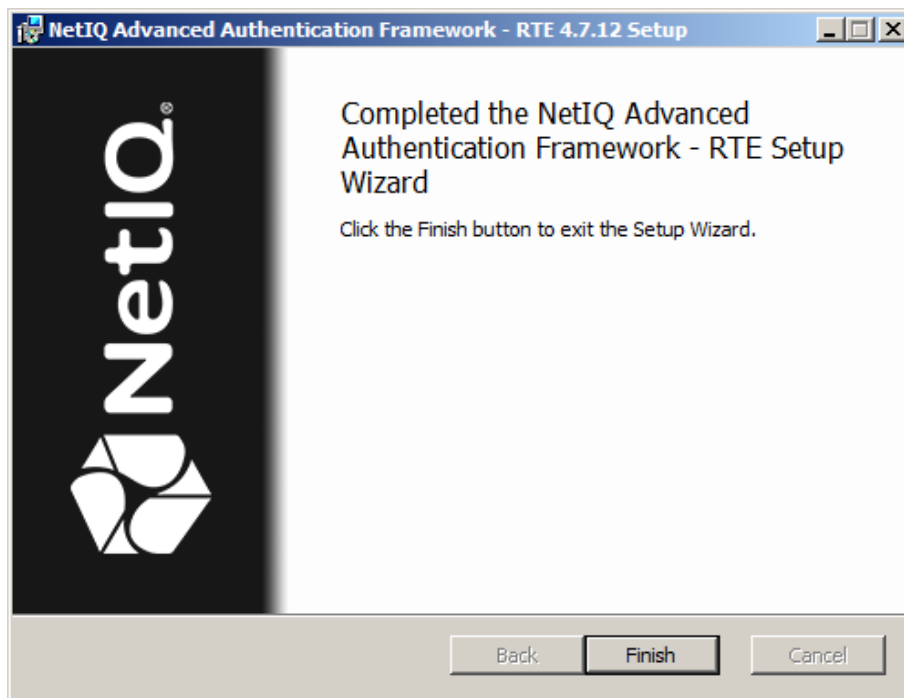
- To change the destination folder, use the **Change** button.
- To continue, click **Next**.

5. Click **Install** and wait until the component is installed.





6. Click **Finish** to close the Wizard.

Microsoft Windows 7/Microsoft Windows Server 2008

1. In the **Start** menu, select **Control panel** and then double-click **Programs and Features**.
2. Select **NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework – RTE** and click **Uninstall**.
3. Confirm the removal.
4. Wait a few seconds until the removal is completed.

Microsoft Windows 2003 Server

1. In the **Start** menu, select **Settings > Control Panel > Add or Remove Programs**.
2. Select **NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework – RTE** and click **Remove**.
3. Confirm the removal.


Microsoft Windows 8/Microsoft Windows Server 2012

1. In the **Search** menu, select **Apps > Control Panel > Programs > Programs and Features**.
2. Select **NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework - RTE** and click **Uninstall**.
3. Confirm the removal.
4. Wait a few seconds until the removal is completed.

Upgrading RTE

In order to upgrade NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework RTE, start to install the new version. You will receive a notification about already existing previous version. Continue the standard installation procedure and your NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework version will be automatically updated.

After the upgrade is complete, the installer may ask you to restart a computer.

 You do not need to remove the previous NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework version in order to upgrade RTE.

Using NetIQ Web Service instead of NetIQ Authenticore Server

NetIQ version 4.7 and later has a possibility to use NetIQ RTE through NetIQ Web Service instead of NetIQ Authenticore Server. But in this case only some of SDK features are available (only obtaining of user credentials).

To use this feature, please create the following parameters in registry key HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\NetIQ:

- IsWSLogon (DWORD) - set to 1;
- WebAuthServer (String) - specify full URL of NetIQ Web Service (including https, port number and folder).

Cannot Install NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework – RTE

Description:

Error appears when installing NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework – RTE on your computer.

Cause:

- a. You are installing NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework – RTE on the network drive.
- b. You have no space left on the disk.
- c. You are installing RTE on the unsupported OS.
- d. You are installing RTE on the OS with the wrong bitness.

Solution:

- a. Change the installation path.
- b. Free the amount of disk space needed for installation.
- c. Check the list of supported OS.
- d. Check your OS's bitness (x64/x86) and run the corresponding installer (x64/x86).

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
