This Installation Guide is intended for all user categories and describes how to install the client part of NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework solution. This document describes the installation used in corporate environment.

About NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework™

NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] is a software solution that enhances the standard user authentication process by providing an opportunity to logon with various types of *authenticators*.

Why choose NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework™?

NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework™...

• ...makes the authentication process easy and secure (no complex passwords, "secret words", etc.).

- ...prevents unauthorized use of your computer and mobile devices.
- ...protects you from fraud, phishing and similar illegal actions online.
- ... can be used to provide secure access to your office.

What is NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework™?

NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] is a system made up of 3 sets of components (Server components, Administrator components and Client components). Working together these components secure your access to data and allow you to forget about your account password.

What is going to happen to my password?

NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] leaves NetlQ administrator a choice to determine whether to allow the use of account password or disable it. If the use of account password is enabled, you can log on with it just like you would without NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™].

If the use of account password is disabled, you can log on with an authenticator only. In this case your account password is changed automatically once you have enrolled an authenticator.

Later on the complex random password is generated and changed at regular intervals specified by NetlQ administrator. Passwords are unknown to everyone, including NetlQ administrator.

NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] Technology

NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] technology relies on authenticator.

Although password authentication is simple and the most common, it has a number of disadvantages:

- a simple password is both easy to remember and to obtain. They can easily be guessed or hacked;
- a complex password is both hard to obtain and to remember. However, users tend to write their long complex passwords down and keep then on their workplaces where anyone else can see them.
- a password can be communicated to anyone else.

Authenticators are better, because they do not complicate logon procedure, but allow users to give up passwords and thus keep access to their information secure. NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] gives users an opportunity to use hardware authentication devices and retains an opportunity to log on by password (on permission from NetIQ administrator).

Authentication devices supported by NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] include biometric scanners, smart cards, tokens, memory cards, etc.

- An authenticator can be enrolled (created) at first logon or at any time later.
- The number of authenticators you can have is defined by NetlQ administrator.
- NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] allows you to manage your authenticators: enroll, re-enroll (edit), test, delete. All these actions require permission from NetIQ administrator.

NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] Supported Features

Supported Authenticator Types

• NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] supports a wide range of authenticator types (biometric authenticators, smart cards, tokens, and one-time passcodes).

NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework[™] Supported Features

- You can enroll authenticator right after your first logon after NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework has been installed;
- You can use different authenticator types (from the available ones) for logging on or unlocking your operating system instead of using weak and unsafe password;
- You can enroll several authenticators (depending on how much the administrator allows you to enroll), re-enroll or delete your authenticators (if you are permitted to);
- You can have your password changed (both, manual and on permission);
- You can execute files or run applications under another user's account using NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework Run As tool;
- You can use authentication in the situation when you're outside of your corporate network or temporary work with network was planned (contact your NetlQ administrator in advance).

System Requirements

😣 Installing and removing NetlQ Client requires Local Admins privileges.

Before installing the product, check that the following system requirements are fulfilled:

- Microsoft Windows 7 (x64/x86) SP1/Microsoft Windows 8.1 (x86/x64)
- 30 Mb free space on hard disk drive

Other requirements:

- One or more Authenticore Servers configured in domain
- Screen resolution should be not lower than 1024x768

Authenticator

Authenticator is data submitted by a user for the purpose of his/her personality validation. Both common character strings (e.g. symbolic password) and data received from a hardware authentication device (e.g. digital fingerprint model, memory card ID) can appear as an authenticator.

Enroll Authenticator

Enroll authenticator means to create an authenticator, "train" the system to recognize it and save the result to the database.

Re-enroll Authenticator

Re-enroll authenticator means to change the authenticator and save the changes to the database.

User Authentication

With NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework, user authentication process includes the following steps:

- 1. When authentication is required, the logon window is displayed and the user is prompted to submit an authenticator.
- 2. When the authenticators match, the user's identity is successfully proven.

User's Workstation

User's workstation is a computer with installed "NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework – Client" package and a hardware authentication device.

Installing and Removing NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client

Authasas Client is an application that allows users to log on using NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework technology. The NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client component is formerly known as NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework Workstation component.

Installing Client

If NetIQ Client should be installed on non-domain client/thin client, it will be necessary to use msi parameter WEBSERVICEURL and specify path to NetIQ Web Service to check the license. E.g.:

msiexec /i client.msi WEBSERVICEURL="https://core.authasas.local:8232/Service.svc/bsc". The start of installation can be frozen for a time up to 1 minute in the case of offline mode.

This delay occurs due to the check of digital signature of component.

To install Client via Setup Wizard:

- 1. Run **Autorun.exe** from NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework distribution kit. Tick **Client** in the list of components and click **Continue**.
- 2. Read the License agreement. Click I accept the terms in the license agreement and then click Next.

Uninstalling Protection

You can provide only certain users with a capability to uninstall NetlQ Client via **Programs and Features**. An applicable user should be the member of the **Local Admins** group and group specified while installing NetlQ Client. In this case NetlQ Client should be installed using the command line:

client.msi /i ONLYALLOWUNINSTALL "<GroupName>", where **<GroupName>** is the name of the group in Active directory. The user should be the member of it. E.g., client.msi /i ONLYALLOWUNINSTALL "NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework Admins".

Sermissions are checked only if uninstallation is initiated via **Programs and Features**. The NetIQ Client can be uninstalled using its msi installer without this check.

Removing Client

If NetIQ Client was installed using the command line, it can be uninstalled only by certain users. For more information, see the <u>Installing Client</u> chapter.

Microsoft Windows 7

- 1. In the Start menu, select Control panel and then double-click Programs and Features.
- 2. Select NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client and click Uninstall.
- 3. Confirm the removal.
- 4. Wait a few seconds until the removal is completed.

Microsoft Windows 8.1/10

- 1. Right click the Start button, select Programs and Features.
- 2. Select NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client and click Uninstall.
- 3. Confirm the removal.
- 4. Wait a few seconds until the removal is completed.

Upgrading Client

In order to upgrade NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client, start to install the new version. You will receive a notification about already existing previous version. Continue the standard installation procedure and your NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework version will be automatically updated.

After the upgrade is complete, the installer may ask you to restart a computer. Restart is obligatory for NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client upgrade.

You do not need to remove the previous NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework version in order to upgrade Client.

Installing and Removing NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client via Group Policy

To install/remove NetlQ Advanced Authentication FrameworkModules, use:

- Group Policy Management Console (GPMC), which is installed by default on a Domain Controller. To open GPMC, click Start and select Administrative Tools > Group Policy Management.
- **Group Policy Management Editor (GPME)**, which can be opened from GPMC. To open GPME, under domain right-click the group policy object (GPO) you are using to install the software and select **Edit**.

It is highly recommended that you do not use **Default Group Policy**, because it is applicable to entire domain. It is not recommended to install/upgrade client components for all workstations at the same time.

To create new Group Policy and configure it:

- 1. Create new global security group and new group policy object.
- 2. Connect them:
 - a. Open created group policy object properties.
 - b. Go to the **Security** tab.
 - c. Remove the Apply Group Policy option for the Authenticated Users group.
 - d. Add created group and mark the Apply Group Policy option for it.

Installing NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client via Group Policy

To install an NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client package using the group policy:

1. In GPME, in the selected GPO under **Computer configuration > Policies > Software Settings**, right-click **Software Installation** and select **New > Package**.



2. Specify the network path to the installer package.

3. In the **Deploy Software** dialog, click **Assigned** and then click **OK**.

5. Open package properties:

a) On **Deployment** tab: remove the **Uninstall this application when it falls out of the scope of management** option. It is done to prevent undesirable uninstallation in case of problems as well as for the upgrade to go properly.

b) On **Deployment** tab click the **Advanced** button: set the **Ignore language when deploying this package** option. If you do not set this option, the package will install only on OS with package's language.



c) Remove the **Make this 32-bit X86 application available to Win64 machines** option (if this option is available).

6. Add appropriate 64-bit installer to this group policy object and use settings 5a)-5b).

The assigned package is installed after you have updated the domain policy and restarted your computer. To update the domain policy immediately, use the gpupdate /force command.

Removing NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client via Group Policy

To remove NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client using the group policy:

1. In GPME, under **Computer Configuration > Software Settings > Software installation**, right-click the deployed package and select **All tasks > Remove**.

2. In the **Remove Software** dialog, click **Immediately uninstall the software from users and computers** and then click **OK**.

The package is removed after you have updated the domain policy and restarted your computer. To update the domain policy immediately, use the gpupdate /force command.

If you have removed the Uninstall this application when it falls out of the scope of management option as it was recommended, software will not be uninstalled after selecting Immediately uninstall the software from users and computers. In this case, you will need to uninstall it via Programs and Features/Add or remove programs.

Upgrading NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client via Group Policy

Option 1: You can add .msi package with new component version to an existing group policy object. However, this option does not prove to be good, because in case of any problems in new version of component, these problems spread on all computers in installation group.

Option 2: The more reliable upgrading procedure implies creating new group policy object for new installers:

1. Create new installation group and new Group Policy Object (GPO), add a new .msi package in it.

2. After having configured software installation, go to the **Upgrades** tab of package properties.

- 4. In Add Upgrade Package dialog select the A specific GPO option.

5. Select a GPO which was used for installation of previous NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework version.

6. Select .msi package name.

7. Select the Uninstall the existing package, then install the upgrade package option.

Cannot Install NetIQ Advanced Authentication Framework – Client

Description:

Error appears when installing NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework – Client on your computer.

Cause:

- a. You are installing NetlQ Advanced Authentication Framework Client on the network drive
- b. You have no space left on the disk
- c. You are installing Client on the unsupported OS
- d. You are installing Client on the OS with the wrong bitness

Solution:

- a. Change the installation path
- b. Free the amount of disk space needed for installation
- c. Check the list of supported OS
- d. Check your OS's bitness (x64/x86) and run the corresponding installer (x64/x86)
